### **Supply List**

#### Please bring to the first class:

#### **Paints**

Instructor uses Utrecht Artist Oil Paints. Feel free to use any brand you prefer. Brands may be mixed. The palette taught will be a split primary palette, with one warm and cool each of red, yellow, and blue, plus raw umber and white.

- Burnt Sienna, 37 ml
- Quinacridone Rose/ Magenta, 37 ml
- Yellow Ochre, 37 ml
- Cadmium Yellow Lemon, 37 ml
- Ultramarine Blue, 37 ml
- Cobalt Blue, 37 ml
- White of choice: Titanium, Titanium/ Zinc blend, or Flake White (Flake White contains Lead), 150 ml
- Raw Umber, 37 ml

Optional additions, in recommended order: Viridian, Naples Yellow Deep, Cadmium Yellow Light, Chromium Oxide Green, and Cadmium Red Medium.

#### **Brushes & Palette**

- Bristle Brushes: Flat or Filbert, long-handled, one or more of each in suggested sizes:
  - + 12 or 10
  - +8 or 6
  - + 4 or 2
- Round soft synthetic or blended brush for tree branches and final touches, size 2
- Palette knives, 1-2; about 2 1/2" in length, stepped, trowel shape
- Palette oil-cured wood, plastic/acrylic without partitions, disposable palette pad, or chinet plate!

#### **Painting Supports (Surfaces)**

- 1-4 per class, no larger than 12"x16"
- Oil paper pad 9"x12" or 12"x16", such as Arches, (larger sizes can be taped off for multiple small studies), or Ampersand gessobords, canvas panels, and/ or other preferred support.

#### Thinner & Medium(s)

- Gamsol (odorless solvent for thinning and cleaning paints), 16 oz.
- Refined Linseed oil, 8 oz.
- Glass jars with airtight, screw on lids, one each for the following purposes and in approximate sizes:

Dirty Gamsol for brush cleaning ~16 oz.

Clean Gamsol for brush cleaning ~16 oz.

Painting Medium ~8 oz.

Suggested simple medium: 1 part Gamsol + 2 parts Linseed Oil, or 1 part Gamsol + 3 parts Linseed Oil, mixed ahead of time.

#### **Optional:**

- Simple store-bought oil painting medium \*must not contain Damar varnish\* ~4 oz.
- Clip-on palette cup(s), or smaller jar, for holding medium while painting

#### **Painting Accessories**

- Nitrile gloves, to protect hands from oil paints and solvents
- Shop towels or cloth paint rags \*do not skimp on rag supply\*
- Jack Richeson's Studio Soap or similar, for final brush cleaning
- Flat boxes/ box lids, or wet panel carrier, for transporting wet paintings
- Sketchbook + pencil

#### Nice but optional:

- Painter's or Artist's Tape (for taping off small studies white or lavender if possible)
- Rolling carry-on suitcase, spacious bag, paint box, or similar item, for gear transport
- French easel
- Wide brimmed hat or visor (if needed, to reduce glare from overhead lights)

#### Supplies provided by MIAD:

- Standing easels
- Stools
